

Sample Answers to Grades 4 Civil Rights Worksheet

1. Segregation is “the separation or isolation of a race, class, or ethnic group by enforced or voluntary residence in a restricted area, by barriers to social intercourse, by separate educational facilities, or by other discriminatory means.”

(Merriam-Webster)

2. African-Americans were segregated in Georgia and in the South in housing, education, transport, social activities, etc.

3. Jim Crow Laws

4. The Civil Rights Movement was a movement to get rid of Jim Crow Law and racially desegregate all public facilities.

5. The Civil Rights Act outlawed segregation in the U.S. schools and public places. It prohibited discrimination in government, public facilities and employment.
